
#### Parkallen Outdoor Movie Night

#### **Edmonton's 5th Historian Laureate**



Parkallen resident Marlena
Wyman is the City of Edmonton's
5th Historian Laureate. In 2010,
the City of Edmonton reinforced
the importance of identifying
and preserving Edmonton's
history by becoming Canada's
first municipality to appoint a
Historian Laureate. The Historian
Laureate is the City's official
ambassador on historical
matters and promotes the
history of the city and its citizens
by documenting, researching,
interpreting and speaking about

the people, places and events that have created Edmonton's distinctive heritage and character.

Marlena is a visual artist who has lived in Edmonton since 1974 and she has made Parkallen her home for 22 years. She was born and raised in southern Alberta on her family farm near Rockford.

Marlena was the Audio/Visual Archivist at the Provincial Archives of Alberta for 28 years, and her artworks are inspired by her research into archival records. In 2011, she received a Historical Recognition Award from the Edmonton Historical Board for her contributions to archives and visual arts.

Marlena has several historybased visual art exhibits planned for her term as Historian Laureate. In her exhibits, she will shine some light on lesser known stories through her archival research, and she encourages her fellow Edmontonians to help fill the gaps in our historical record. #### Maurice Demers - Old time Parkallen Resident Turns 99!

In June, Maurice Demers was surprised to read the marquee at his favourite A&W location and find it wishing him a happy 99th birthday. Inside, he was delighted to find over 40 family and friends - including a dedicated and friendly staff who have know him for decades - gathered to share a meal and wish him well.

Maurice Demers was born June 10, 1919 and grew up on a farm south of Beaumont and after the passing of his parents (who both died in their 50's) he took over the farm. He sold out after a year of crop failure and disease that ravaged his herd of hogs. He was 34 when he came to the city. He remembers feeling immediately at home in his new neighbourhood where the neighbours helped each other out and everyone was friendly.

Parkallen had just been developed a few years prior to Maurice and his new bride Leona's arrival in 1956 and their purchase of a tidy bungalow at 6827 112 Street where they raised two children Gordon and Bernadette. Maurice's granddaughter Jennifer recently gave birth to great granddaughter Marley Leona who joined her two-year-old brother Logan on May 28, 2017. Maurice and Leona celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary June 27, 2016.

Maurice and Leona's home, along with many others in Parkallen, was built by Fekete Homes, for whom Maurice went to work as a carpenter, building the Tamarack Apartment on 111 Street and 68 Avenue in Parkallen and homes near Southgate and the suburban communities of Millwoods and Castledowns. He felt Parkallen was a great community because it was close to everything - local businesses, schools and St. Agnes Church where Maurice and Leona attended for many years and where their children were baptised and confirmed.

Maurice remembers the city ending at 61 Avenue with nothing but farmland to the south. There was a Mink ranch at the south end of 109 Street north of 51 Avenue. He remembers the early days before the City planted the boulevard elm and ash trees and has watched them grow into the beautiful canopy that arches over his street. He also remembers a bakery, grocery and gas station located in the commercial strip across from the park as well as a the Chorny Drugstore on the corner of 70 Avenue & 109 Street owned by Royal Canadian Airforce Veteran Walter Chorny (currently Smiles), a hardware store once occupied the Parkallen Restaurant and a donut shop preceded a number of businesses in the location of Rick and Alice's restaurant. He also remembers the severe hailstorm that occurred the day of the tornado in July 1987 and the flooding in 2004.

At the age of 99, Maurice has no regrets about moving to Parkallen and staying. He still enjoys puttering in his yard keeping it tidy and for years has kept his trees trimmed and manicured, although for the past few he has paid someone for this service because he's not allowed up the ladder any more! Maurice notices changes in Parkallen with new infill development and hopes things don't change too much in Parkallen or that it loses its friendly atmosphere. His advice to new people moving in is to get to know your neighbour and keep Parkallen the friendly community it has also been. Maurice enjoys attending the Parkallen Senior's Dinners with his son Gordon who now lives with him and thinks these are a wonderful event to bring people of the community together.

When asked if he had any wisdom to impart, Maurice said his father always said, "You have two eyes to see more with, two ears to listen better with and one tongue to use as least as possible, so you don't get in trouble." This can be applied to keep Parkallen the wonderful neighbourhood it is – if you see something to be done, get involved; if you hear someone needs help, lend a hand and always be grateful for the unique and special community we all share.

The festival runs at the end of August, near the Strathcona Farmer's Market. Shows are chosen by lottery! This means that all artists have an equal chance of presenting their work. The Fringe has lottery categories for local and international artists. There is an amazing amount of diverse work at the Fringe, with something for everyone!

All ticket sales go to the Artists. Supporting artists directly can be a challenge, and the Fringe is one of the best ways to support new and independent work. As an artist with a show in the Fringe festival this past year, I can assure you this is a unique


and important way for artists to develop their craft.

There is a Kids' Fringe, which is an amazing opportunity to introduce children of all ages to theatre! Kids' Fringe is located on a different site than the main Fringe; this safe environment is great for kids and parents alike, with crafts and activities for the kids in addition to shows.

The amount of shows at the Fringe can be overwhelming. Reviews can be conflicting, and sometimes you don't see a review until too late in a run! A great way to see Fringe shows is to head on down to the Daily Discount box office. This has shows which are on sale for that day only. You can also select the "Fringe Randomizer", which will randomly pick a show for you. The possibilities are endless!

Local businesses have great deals and features during the Fringe. Many also support artists by displaying their posters and work. Head out for a drink on Whyte and see what the people are saying! And of course, there are great events like L'After Show at the Grindstone Theatre, which features interviews and snippets of shows featuring artists with the Fringe. A new and local theatre with comedy, sketch, stand up and musical theatre, the Grindstone is also a great place to support local artists during the year.

Feeling Fringey? The Fringe lottery selection process takes place in November; keep your eyes peeled! The Fringe Headquarters will host this event, and you can start your Fringe research. You just may find your new favourite artist!
